Subject: Dry Wheat Pasta (Preliminary Injury Inquiry No. PI-2017-004)

In a letter dated December 28, 2017, the Canadian International Trade Tribunal received notice that the President of the Canada Border Services Agency had initiated investigations into the alleged injurious dumping and subsidizing of all dry wheat-based pasta, not stuffed or otherwise prepared, and not containing more than two percent eggs, whether or not enriched, fortified, organic, whole wheat or containing milk or other ingredients, originating in or exported from the Republic of Turkey, excluding refrigerated, frozen or canned pasta.

Following receipt of the notice, the Tribunal initiated a preliminary injury inquiry pursuant to subsection 34(2) of the *Special Import Measures Act (SIMA)*. The notice of commencement of the preliminary injury inquiry dated December 29, 2017, was published in Part I of the January 13, 2018, edition of the *Canada Gazette*.

Having completed the preliminary injury inquiry, in accordance with subsection 37.1(1) of *SIMA*, the Tribunal made its preliminary determination of injury on February 26, 2018. Enclosed is a copy of the preliminary determination of injury, in English and in French. The statement of reasons will be issued within 15 days.

IN THE MATTER OF a preliminary injury inquiry, pursuant to subsection 34(2) of the *Special Import Measures Act*, respecting:

**DRY WHEAT PASTA ORIGINATING IN OR EXPORTED FROM THE  
REPUBLIC OF TURKEY**

**PRELIMINARY DETERMINATION**

The Canadian International Trade Tribunal, pursuant to the provisions of subsection 34(2) of the *Special Import Measures Act*, has conducted a preliminary injury inquiry into whether the evidence discloses a reasonable indication that the alleged dumping and subsidizing of all dry wheat-based pasta, not stuffed or otherwise prepared, and not containing more than two percent eggs, whether or not enriched, fortified, organic, whole wheat or containing milk or other ingredients, originating in or exported from the Republic of Turkey, excluding refrigerated, frozen or canned pasta, have caused injury or retardation or are threatening to cause injury.

This preliminary injury inquiry follows the notification, on December 28, 2017, that the President of the Canada Border Services Agency had initiated investigations into the alleged injurious dumping and subsidizing of the above-mentioned goods.

Pursuant to subsection 37.1(1) of the *Special Import Measures Act*, the Canadian International Trade Tribunal hereby determines that there is evidence that discloses a reasonable indication that the dumping and subsidizing of the above-mentioned goods have caused or are threatening to cause injury to the domestic industry.
