

Dear Ahmet,

We will conduct the circumvention inquiries pursuant to section 781 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, and our regulations at 19 CFR 351.226. Commerce's regulations at 19 CFR 351.226(f)(3) state, "Following initiation of a circumvention inquiry under paragraph (b) or (d) of this section, the Secretary may issue questionnaires and verify submissions received, where appropriate. The Secretary may limit issuance of questionnaires to a reasonable number of respondents."

In addition, please see below instructions for interested parties wishing to monitor or participate in the circumvention inquiries:

- If you do not plan to actively participate in the inquiry as a party, you can monitor the inquiry by creating an account on the ACCESS portal. To do this, go to <https://access.trade.gov> and click on "E-Filer Registration" to register for an account. Step by step instructions can be found in the user guide, here https://access.trade.gov/help/ACCESS_User_Guide.pdf. When logged into ACCESS, you can monitor the inquiry by searching for the case number (A-570-028).
- If you are planning to participate in the inquiry, you will need to submit an entry of appearance in the ACCESS portal. To do this, go to <https://access.trade.gov> and click on "E-Filer Registration" to register for an account. Step by step instructions can be found in the user guide, here https://access.trade.gov/help/ACCESS_User_Guide.pdf. After it is approved, you can log into ACCESS and click on "Manage Entry of Appearance," and on the next screen, click on "Create New Entry of Appearance."
